

Motor Association

Meeting.

The Newfoundland Motor Association held a most enthusiastic meeting in the Board of Trade rooms, yesterday evening at 4 o'clock, and a large amount of important business was transacted. A report was received from Mr. T. Soper of the Road Commission stating that the road machinery had finished this season's work. The grader used in connection with this machinery will be brought to town and will be used during the winter months in keeping the roads in the city free of snow. This machine has been used with great success in many of the large Canadian cities. Mr. Soper also reported that considerable additional machinery had been ordered, which will make the equipment absolutely complete for next season's work. A committee was appointed to take into consideration the 1920 motor tax and recommend to the government such alterations and amendments for the season of 1921 as would meet with the approval of all classes of motor owners. The Association have decided to hold a dinner at Donovan's during the week of Nov. 8th to which all members and their friends will be invited. The committee to look after all arrangements in connection with the affair was appointed as follows:—Messrs. W. White, P. E. Outerbridge, Leslie Marshall, Arch Munn and Reg Harvey, and with such a committee it goes without saying that the motorists' dinner will be the success of the season. The meeting recommended that the Association appoint a solicitor to follow all police court cases in which motorists are concerned and to look after the interests of members generally. A letter was received from the relatives of the late J. L. Slattery, who was a member of the executive of the Association, thanking the Association for the note of condolence that they had passed on the passing of the deceased. After some other business of minor importance had been discussed the meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.

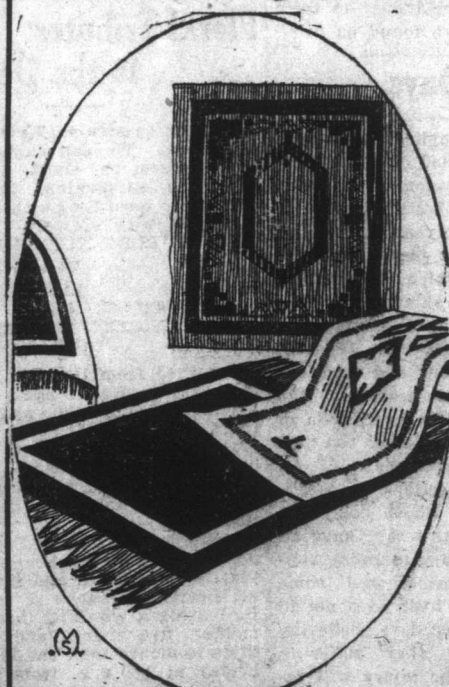
