We handle all requests for offers the same day received, usually within two hours." "You sell without the trouble of packing, with no fuss or bother. We buy at your home, and send auto." You probably buy for cash. If so, put the word in your Want Ad. Don't leave it for readers to assume you pay cash.

Many won't do that, 'phoning instead the dealer who definitely offers cash in his Want Ad. If you plan to pay at least as much as any other dealer, put

'Highest prices paid,' in your Want Ad. There are several things you can do to make your Want Ad stick out from others. Perhaps you can use one or more of these statements, any one of which will help you: "Oldest dealer in town," "Fastest growing business in town in our line," "Largest used clothing dealer in county."

Still another method is to write your Want Ad in the first person, as in, "I buy all American and Foreign coins." When you have developed a steady supply, make your Want Ads find for you the hard-to-get articles, by mentioning
