SEES CHANGES IN VICTORIA MANNERS

Like all the former members of the bakafu (the Shogun's government) Prince Tokugawa serves the Emperor who sits on the throne and he has seen his share of the changes in manners since the Shogunate was overthrown.
The Emperor's Yedo rule in name, but the reins of power were held successively by ambitious and forceful nobles, until the rise of the Fujiwara, the Taira, the Minamoto, the Ashikaga, the Hojo, and then the Tokugawa. The Shogun never permitted usurpation of power, failed to recognize the public devotion to the Emperor, whose line is credited with beginning with the gods. The Emperor, kept in seclusion was to the people the source of authority, but the name of an Emperor, after the Shogun was abolished, appointed their governors and governed the land in the name of an Emperor. Early travellers into this stage of the Shogun's rule were publishing descriptions of spiritual and temporal emperors, of dual governments of Misako and Shogun.
