THE PARLIAMENT OF ULSTER

ANTI-HOME RULERS IN CONVENTION AT BELFAST.

Five Hundred Delegates Attend the First Sitting of the Parliament—Ten Resolutions Elected to the Council—Dr. Kane Treatment—Resolutions Passed Opposing Home Rule and Separation.

BELFAST, Oct. 24.—The Ulster Parliament assembled to-day in Ulster Hall. The parliament consists of 600 members elected by the Unionists in order to take measures to resist Home Rule.

The meeting of the Ulster Parliament aroused much interest in the city. The streets were crowded with people, and the neighborhood of Ulster Hall was packed with citizens desirous of witnessing the assembly of the anti-Home Rule delegates.

The sitting was conducted in private, but it transpired that the Duke of Abercorn was unanimously elected president, for which the National Anthem was sung.

No separation. The parliament passed a resolution declaring the intention and determination of the Unionists to adhere to their British citizenship and to remain loyal to the Imperial Parliament and repudiating as degrading the position assigned to Ulster by the Home Rule bill.

Col. Sanderson, M.P. for Armagh, said that Ulster would be willing to obey the law passed by the Imperial Parliament, but that Parliament should choose to oust Ulster loyalists from Great Britain. Then the loyalists would feel no longer bound to obey.

Rev. Dr. Kane, Grand Master of the Orange Order, said that the most serious danger to the Empire was the Home Rule bill. He called for a united front against the bill.

A heated discussion took place during the day session on the question whether all the Ulster parishes could be included in the Central Council.

Two Presbyterian clergymen moved that only 10 parishes be allowed to sit in the central council. The motion was carried.

Rev. Mr. Kane supported this amendment, and as a result resolutions were made to denounce him from the mastership of the Orange society.

Most of the members were so dissatisfied with the proceedings that they refused to attend the meeting to raise a guarantee fund which could not be called upon unless a parliament was elected.

A vote of thanks to the lords. The public was admitted to the meeting hall at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, and further resolutions were offered and carried.

While the Ulster Parliament was in session a simultaneous conference of Unionist women was being held in the hall.

ASK REDMOND TO APPROVE RESTRICTIONS ON HIS HOLDINGS BY FORCE.

CONK, Oct. 24.—A delegation of tenants who had been evicted from their holdings waited on John Redmond, M.P. for Waterford City, and requested him to support the section of the Irish Parliamentary party, yesterday and asked him to approve a project having as its aim the forcible re-taking of farms from which they had been evicted.

Mr. Redmond advised his visitors to wait until it was seen whether the Government passed a reinstatement bill. He blamed the Anti-Farmlet members of the House of Commons for the present situation.
