REV. G. P. RAYMOND SPEAKS ON IMMIGRATION NEEDS He Emphasized the Need of Larger

Rural Population For Maririmes.

Berwick .- A very interesting address was given by the Rev. G. P. Raymond under the auspices of the Young People's League of the Union Church on Monday evening. In his usual eloquent and effective manner, Mr. Raymond dealt with the problem of the development and colonization of Canada and more particularly of the Maritimes. He emphasized the fundamental importance of agriculture as our basic industry, and the need of a larger rural population. The Maritimes have their own peculiar problems to face, one of the most difficult being that of how we can keep our young people at home, and our young men on the farms. The growth of our population by immigration and natural increase, during the last decade, was far from satisfactory, almost discouraging. Only a small number of immigrants find their way into Nova Scotla, and many of these do not remain permanently. Our native English speaking parents are inclined to small families, and our young people, when they grow to manhood and womanhood, feel the lure of the West or the United States and early in life make their way thither. And all the while our own Province offers just as good opporunities as these countries to where they go. The speaker hoped that there might be found some way of olving these problems, and especially that of keeping our native born population at home, and made an earnest plea for a greater and more intelligent interest in the welfare and progress of our Province, on the part of all its citizens. Mr. Raymond's address was thoroughly enjoyed and appreciated by all present.
