DEAR MR. REID:

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 15, 1952, referring de to an exchange of letters dated March 15 and 16, 1951, by which our Govern her ments renewed for the duration of 1951 an agreement first entered into 1942 for the exchange of harvesting machinery and crews in the prairies regions of Canada and the United States, and for other movements of farm de labor between our two countries.

It is noted that during the past year the results achieved under this de agreement have proved very satisfactory, and that for this reason the Canadia, hen Government wishes to extend the agreement through 1952. I am instructed new by my Government to state that the United States Government also desire Dro to extend the agreement through the calendar year 1952. The details for an effecting the program should, as in previous years, be arranged directly between the Canadian and United States authorities concerned.

In conformity with your Government's suggestion, your letter of April 15 au 1952, and this reply are being considered as constituting the formal extension la
