

(C) COMMONWEALTH AND FOREIGN GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES  
IN CANADA

1. On November 1st, His Excellency Dr. Honorio Leguizamon Pondal presented to the Administrator of the Government of Canada his Letter of Credence, as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Argentina in Canada (Press Release No. 92, November 1).
2. On November 2nd, His Excellency Dr. Mariano Brull y Caballero presented to the Administrator of the Government of Canada his Letter of Credence, as first Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of Cuba in Canada. (Press Release No. 93, November 2).
3. On November 12th, His Excellency Constantine Sakellaropoulos presented to the Administrator of the Government of Canada his Letter of Credence as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Greece in Canada. (Press Release No. 98, November 12).
4. In November Mr. Knut Orre replaced Mr. Ditlef Knudson as First Secretary at the Norwegian Legation.
5. Mr. Mario da Cunha e Silva, Second Secretary at the Brazilian Embassy, has returned to Rio de Janeiro.
6. Miss (Dr.) Silvia Shelton was appointed Second Secretary at the Cuban Legation in Ottawa.
7. Mr. Sun Tse Ping, Attaché at the Chinese Embassy has returned to China.
8. Lt.-Col. Gregori Popov was appointed Assistant Military Attaché at the Embassy of the U.S.S.R.
9. Changes at the French Embassy include the appointment of Mr. Bernier LeChartier as Commercial Counsellor and Acting Financial Attaché to replace Mr. G. Paul-Boncour who has returned to France; and the arrival of Mr. Jacques Humbert to take up his duties as Commercial Attaché.
10. Mr. Melbourne Pratt has replaced Mr. Thomas Dunbabin, as Press Attaché at the Office of the High Commissioner for Australia.

(D) VISITS OF COMMONWEALTH AND FOREIGN

The Rt. Hon. Clement R. Attlee, F.C., M.P., Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, accompanied by the Rt. Hon. While in Ottawa Mr. Attlee had luncheon at Laurier House with Mr. Mackenzie King, laid a wreath at the National War Memorial, was guest of honour at a dinner given at the Country Club by the Prime Minister on behalf of the Government of Canada, and addressed a joint session of the Senate and the House of Commons.
