## EIGHTH COMMONWEALTH EDUCATION CONFERENCE

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, Mark MacGuigan, announced today that Charles G. Gallagher, Minister of Education, New Brunswick, will lead the Canadian Delegation to the Eighth Commonwealth Education Conference to be held in Colombo, Sri Lanka, from the 5th to the 13th of August, 1980.

The theme of the conference is "Education and the Development of Human Resources". Briefly, its objectives will be to review present schemes of Commonwealth co-operation in education, focus attention on major educational trends and problems, and identify means by which further Commonwealth co-operation might benefit member countries. Among the subjects to be discussed are the future of the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan, the development of technical, scientific and mathematical education and the role of non-formal education.

The first four days of the conference will focus mainly on expert level discussion of technical matters. The second part of the conference will consist of a plenary session at the ministerial level.
