PRAYERS

Mr. Leblanc (Laurier), from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Estimates, presented the Sixth Report of the Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Friday, May 16, 1975, your Committee has considered Bill C-24, An Act to amend the Salaries Act and has agreed to report it without amendment.

A copy of the Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence relating to this Bill (*Issue No. 37*) is tabled.

Mr. Blaker, from the Standing Committee on Privileges and Elections, presented the Fifth Report of the Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Tuesday, December 10, 1974, which reads as follows:

Ordered.—That the Green Paper entitled “Members of Parliament and Conflict of Interest” tabled on

November 27, 1974, be referred to the Standing Committee on Privileges and Elections; and

That, after the Committee has concluded its deliberations and submitted its report on the aforementioned matter, it be authorized to consider and make recommendations upon the subject-matter of Ministers and conflict of interest and Public Servants and conflict of interest.”

Your Committee has held twenty-one meetings, heard departmental witnesses and considered research documents prepared for it by the staff of the Research Branch of the Library of Parliament, to whom your Committee wishes to express its appreciation.

Your Committee endorses the principles set forth in the Green Paper entitled “Members of Parliament and Conflict of Interest” and recommends to the House of Commons the proposals contained therein, subject to their amendment, deletion and expansion as set forth in this Report.
