

date was it set up (b) what are the names and qualifications of the (i) present members (ii) previous members of the council?

Mr. Peter Stollery (Parliamentary Secretary to Secretary of State and Minister of Communications): I am informed by the Public Archives as follows: the Public Records order (P.C. 1966-1749, dated 9 September, 1966) provided for the establishment of the Advisory Council on Public Records (ACPR). The order in council specified that the council was to be under the chairmanship of the Dominion Archivist who would nominate 12 members and present the nominations to the Treasury Board for approval.

(a) The members were appointed on February 8, 1967, under the authority of Treasury Board minute T.B. 664903. The first meeting was held on July 17, 1967.

(b) The Public Records order states that nine members are to be appointed from government departments and agencies, including the Treasury Board at all times. Traditionally, these people have been records managers of major government departments with a great deal of experience in the field of records management. Three members from outside the public service are appointed as representatives of the Canadian Historical Association (CHA), The Canadian Political Science Association (CPSA) and the Records Management Institute (RMI).
