You will recall too that the Torrens Title was made compulsory and the whole system generally over-hauled. I joined the C. E. F. in Ottawa but was retained in the Seperation and Assigned Pay Branck which was greatly in arrears. In 1918 I was transferred to the Judge Advocates Branch as Assistant and remained there until demobilized in 1921 I feel sure that you will not mind giving me your support in rais matter.
