
ADDRESSES, REMONSTRANCES, and
PETITIONS, &c.

T U R N E R, *Mayor.*

In a Meeting or Assembly of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Liverymen of the several Companies of the City of *London*, in Common Hall assembled, at the *Guildball* of the said City, on *Saturday*, the Twenty-fourth Day of *June*, 1769.

MR. *Michael Lovel* produced a Petition to his Majesty, which he said he had prepared with the Assistance of several Liverymen, a Motion was then made, that the said Petition be read, the same was read accordingly; and the Lord Mayor objecting to the Title of the Petition, being called, The Petition of the Lord Mayor, Commonalty, and Livery of the City of *London*, another Petition was produced, intituled, The humble Petition of the Livery of the City of *London*, in Common Hall assembled; which was then read, and upon the Question being put, that this Petition be presented to his Majesty, the same was unanimously agreed to by holding up of Hands.
