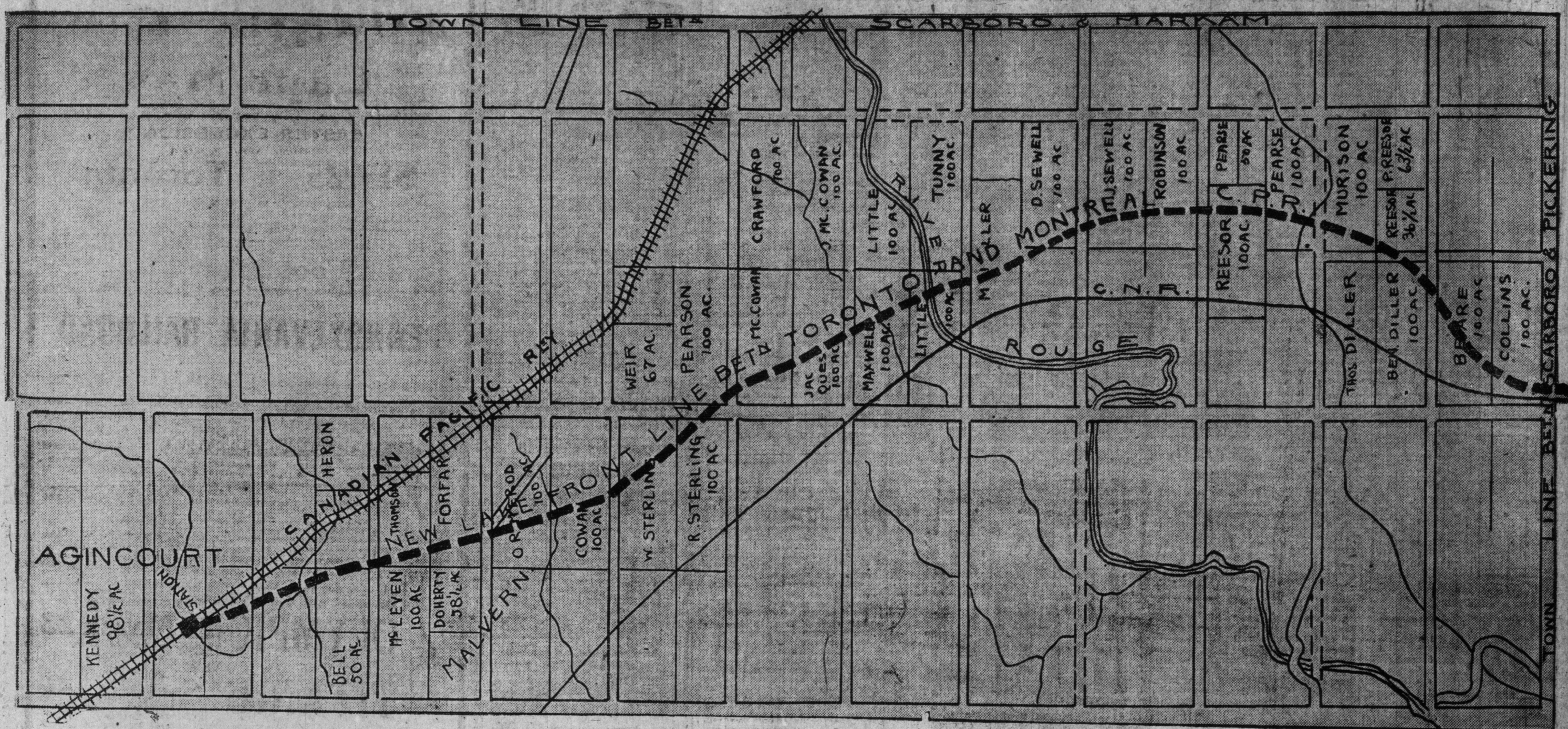


NEW C. P. R. LINE EASTERLY FROM AGINCOURT THRU SCARBORO.
