The results are given of experiments at the Ontario Agricultural College, and it is published in advance of the college report in order that the farmers may get it before sending their crops to market.

300 LIVES LOST. Chinese Fleet of Boats Caught in a Sea of Fire.

Hongkong, March 21.—Three hundred people have lost their lives at Wuchow, the treaty port on the West River, nearly 200 miles from Hongkong.

At this time of the year the place is crowded with natives arriving at the Chinese new year's festival, and is unusually packed. Half the people have their homes in sampans, sloops, boats and junks and moor in the river.

A few nights ago tongues of flame were seen to shoot up from the packed boats and spread from one to another. As the frail craft were becalmed their bamboo moorings they drifted and spread the fire to pontoons.

The people aboard were fighting helplessly, jostling each other in the water in their efforts to get to safety. At least 300 perished, either in the flames or by drowning, the exact number will never be known.
