Cattle receipts at Chicago to-day, 17,000, including 1500 Texans and 5000 Westerns. Market steady.

Bradstreet reports an increase this week of 1,500,000 bush in visible supply.

The visible supply of wheat from this time on will draw nearer to the total of 1,000,000,000 bush than at any time since the increase, though, from this on will not be so large as in 1895.
