# WHEAT MARKETS EASIER,

Cables Lower and Chicago Futures Heavy.

Trading at Chicago Within Narrow Limits, With the Public Mostly Out of It—Australian Advances—Thomson's Report on Corn Crop and Surplus—Notes and Gossip.

Saturday Evening, Dec. 3.  
Liverpool wheat futures were easy to-day, and closed 1/4 to 1/2 per cent below yesterday's last quotation.  
Paris wheat declined 1/2 to 10 centimes, and flour 25 to 30 centimes.  
Chicago futures followed suit, easing off a net 1/4 per bushel for the day.  
Liverpool maize to-day was easier for spot and a fraction higher for future delivery. Chicago corn futures held about firm.

May wheat puts at Chicago to-day, 66c; calls, 66 1/2c. May corn puts, 34c; calls, 34 1/2c.

Pean advanced 1/4 at Liverpool.  
Cheese advanced another shilling at Liverpool to-day.  
Total clearances to-day: Wheat and flour, 978,000 bushels; corn, 442,210 bushels. Exports at New York to-day: Flour, 6340 barrels and 7874 sacks; wheat, 75,000 bushels.

Roumania exported this week 12,500 tons of wheat, against 17,000 last week.  
St. Louis wheat receipts to-day, 68,648 bushels, against 33,882, the same day of 1892.

Wheat receipts at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day, 1452 cars, against 890 the same day of 1892.

Car receipts of grain at Chicago to-day: Wheat 130, corn 434, oats 310. Estimated for Monday: Wheat 130, corn 420, oats 380.

English farmers' deliveries of wheat the past week, 72,800 quarters, at an average price of 27s 7d.

Thomson's crop report estimates American yield of corn at 1,780,000,000 bushels, and says merchantable corn is only 1,400,000,000 bushels.

Sydney, N.S.W., reported the official wheat harvest 1892-93 at 1,300,000 bushels in excess of 1891, and there will be an exportable wheat surplus of 2,500,000 bushels.

Bradstreet's prices this week for exports of wheat and flour from both coasts at 74 1/2c, 60c bushels, against 67 1/2c bushels the corresponding week of 1892.

Corn exports, 4,420,980 bushels, against 3,886,000 bushels.
