Saturday Evening, Dec. 3.

The event of the past week in the financial world of London was the withdrawal of large amounts of gold for German and American account. Europe has for some lime past been guilty of the anomaly of increasing its investment holdings of American securities, though it was siready ourrowing large sums in the New York market to liquidate commercial obligations. The British speculative communisty did not seem to heed the situation till the American withdrawals of gold from the Bank of England brought 4t to their attention. These withdrawals, therefore, caused a drop of 9-16 in British consols, and the throwing of a lot of American stocks on the market. The result was quite a shock to Wall-street, but the heavy foreign pressure was so well met by domestic buying that no serious break occurred. An interesting feature of this stipport as none is that it apparently came, from the self-protective measures of speculative interests with large outstanding commitments. The fact that the resistance did not come from the public is shown in the absence of any increased commission house business. With the subsidence of the London scare and the failure of the Bank of England to raise its discount rate the Wall-street market foundation for this buoyancy is seen in the appeared showings of nearly all railway binds 200 at 200 a Saturday Evening, Dec. 3.
