It is confidently predicted by the Military Committee that the tattoo at Hamilton's Point on Wednesday and Thursday evenings will be of such an impressive character as has never been seen in military or musical events yet held in Canada. A number of new features will be introduced in the musical part of the program, while the illustrations of the military and patriotic displays. It is proposed to make the entertainment of both Wednesday and Thursday evenings the occasion of a great patriotic celebration, and the presence in the grand stand of hundreds of trained voices under the direction of Mr. H. M. Blight, all of them singing the national airs, will make the event most inspiring to the public.

In addition to all these attractions, the illuminated night balloon ascent, with parachute drop in fire, by Prof. E. H. Hutchinson, the intrepid military aviator, will be a novelty that will be sure to attract the audience by its exciting and thrilling character. The event is in aid of the regiments at Nordheimer's reserved seats of \$1.00. Owing to the number of excursions from outside points arranged for the second evening, the Toronto people will find some crowding by taking seats for the first night.

At the Point Next Week.
Next week at Hamilton's Point the air will be resonant with the music of the military band. This evening will see the conclusion of the very excellent entertainment offered, and a special attraction in the program will be a black-face sketch by Mr. Beauchamp, comedian, who will make his professional debut at Hamilton's Point.

To-morrow evening there will be a Sunday concert, in which Horace Somerset, E. K. Kye, George Beech and W. J. Anderson will be soloists. The Andersons will supply the music. Every night next week a wonderful act is presented in the remarkable illuminated balloon ascent with parachute drop in fire, by Prof. E. H. Hutchinson, the fearless aviator, who will make his professional debut at Hamilton's Point.

In connection with the balloon ascent there will be a hand concert each evening, and admission will be free, except on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, when the balloon ascent will be given in connection with the grand tattoo.
