

Paris, May 10 .- The Marquis de Barhelemy, who with Count de Pourtales perates the French concession at Kamranh Bay, Annam, in the course of an interview to-day denies that he furnished coal or provisions to the Russian Pacific squadron. He said: "The maximum of our coaling facilities is 700 tons. A small coaling depot exists on the Mekong River, not far from Saigon. At the outset of the war the Russians bought a large tract of land there, erected sheds and accumu-lated supplies, particularly coal, which was bought originally from Japan. It is to this depot that Admiral Rojest-vensky sent his colliers, but no war-ships approached the depot. This was Russian coal, placed upon Russian tand and loaded upon Russian transports. This was not a violation of neutrality. France could not prevent the Rus-sians from taking their own coal on their own land. If the natives were at fault in selling the land to the Rus-sians the Japanese would not have waited 15 months before protesting." Altho the Marquis de Barthelemy gives the foregoing as a refutation of the charges, the statement concerning the Russian coal depot on the Mekong may open a new phase of the ques-tion. from Saigon. 

THE LAST HOME RULE DEBATE.

Unreality characterized the debate in the British house of commons upon the motion of the opposition leader, censuring the policy and proceedings of the government connected with and subsequent to the appointment of the permanent under secretary, Sir Anthony Macdonell. Perhaps the most interesting episode in it was the speech of William O'Brien, who declared for a settlement by conciliation and a peace conference, rather a novel view for one of the heroes of the earlier agitation. The prime minister took the opportunity again to affirm his hostility to home rule, while Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman was judiciously vague, and afforded not the slightest indication of the method of dealing with this perplexing question, favored by the party of which he is nominally the head.






