

THE POLLS ON TELEPHONES.

Chief Clerk Stratton Makes an Appeal

TO THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

He Opposes Toronto Council's Petition to Keep Down the Rates.

Says the Queen City Wants to Grab Everything—The Committee West Against Toronto-Petition from St. John, N. B.

Also Declined—Early Closing of Schools—Three Thousand Children to Parade in the Jubilee Procession—General News from the Ambitious City.

Hamilton, May 6.—(Special.)—Chief Clerk Stratton of the Ontario Department of the Bell Telephone Company appeared before the City Finance Committee to-night to oppose the petition of the Toronto Council asking support in its protest against the telephone company's proposed increase of rates.

Mr. Stratton pointed out that while office rates in the two cities were the same, residential rates were \$20 in Toronto as against \$30 in Hamilton. Toronto's rate was, further, two or three times lower than that enjoyed by any of the same class in the States.

The committee decided against supporting the Toronto petition unless justified by the equity of the commission. The request of St. John, N.B., that the city put in a special case against a measure of Dominion officers' salaries, was refused.

A bill was framed amending to legislation the bill confirming the agreement between the T.E.B. and C.P.R. and other matters but it was strongly the opinion of the committee that the best office of the T.E.B. should be removed from Toronto to Hamilton.

In accordance with the petition of 10 out of 21 city book and shoe retailers, a year was decided requiring early closing, but the hour was changed from 6.30 to 7.

Children and the Jubilee. The Board of Education to-night decided to have all children above the third grade, some 3000 in number, in the Jubilee procession. In command will be school inspector William Priddy, R. C. Macdonald and Serg. Higgins. The children will wear three patriotic songs.

The public school report for April shows a daily attendance of 7201, the largest for years. W. H. Davis was appointed tonight public school examiner.
