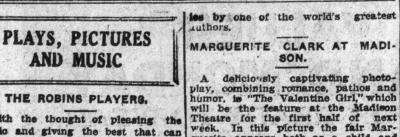


With the thought of pleasing the public and giving the best that can be secured in theatricals, the Robins Players will next week present Miss Florence Roberts, supported by the




