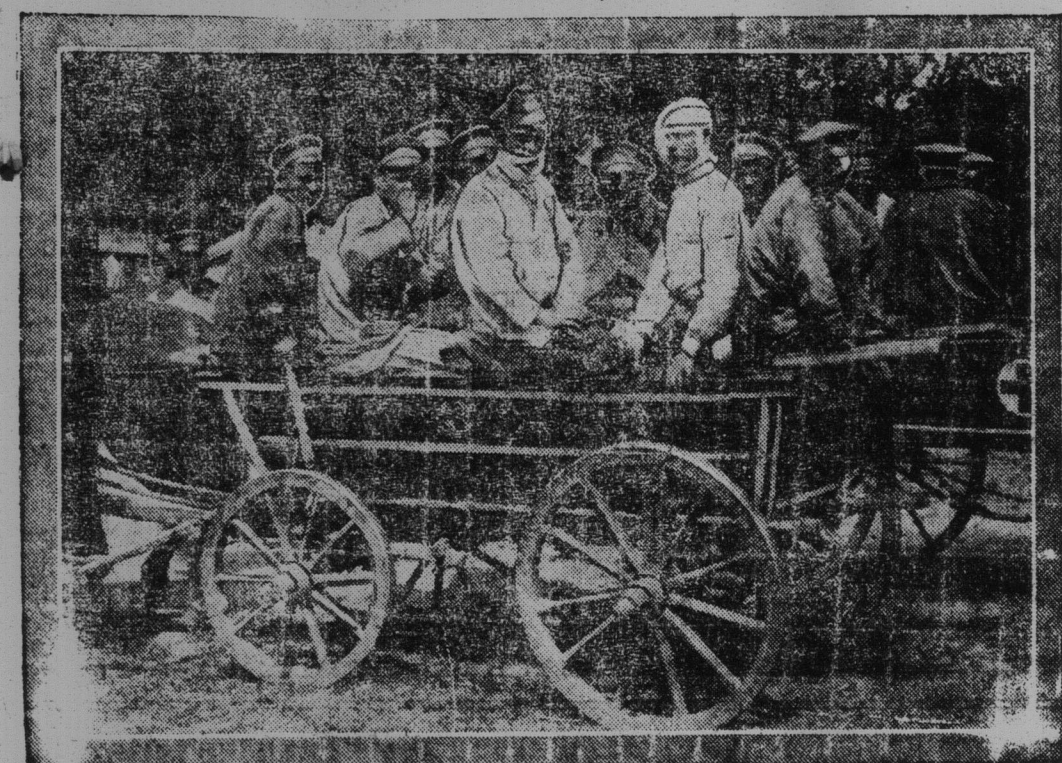


Photo shows Russian wounded waiting to be sent to the rear.

Where is the American Legion—that regiment that was to have done in France what Roosevelt's Rough Riders did in Cuba? Where is it?  
With bands playing, and colors waving, the American Legion marched through Toronto, on a bright day of last spring, bound for Quebec, and thence overseas to the fighting line. It never reached the fighting line. It never even reached Quebec. It just dropped quietly out of sight. It became the Lost Legion.

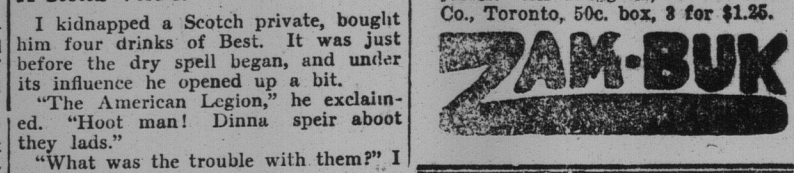

about recruits. It was the autumn of 1915. Navigation had recently closed and the border cities were full of tourists about of the lake steamer. Prosperity had not yet reached its full tide, and the same cities were full of unemployed men, hoboes, and pushovers.

The recruiting officers were jammed with applicants. Little discretion was used in the choice made. The physical examination was a joke. Hundreds entered, the battalion merely to obtain some money for the winter. Each of them drew \$33 a month besides board, lodging and clothes. Many of them were not fit to be sent overseas. There were no more recruits. The hobo element there were adventurers from all over the United States.

Many of the men took the whole thing as a joke, and used the uniform merely as a license to commit all kinds of disorders. The provost guards had to be increased in number in order to check their doings.

Raise 3,000 Men  
The American Legion is said to have recruited between 8,000 and 4,000 men. The curious fact was that the legion had no office until the month of January. It was a little or no discipline among them. He obtained tens of thousands of dollars from the legion. He was ready to join the colors. Hughes commissioned him as colonel, and let him march with the legion. He was succeeded by Col. Jolly, who had served as an officer of marines at Vera Cruz. No doubt Col. Jolly was a good marine officer, but he did not prove a very efficient organizer.

## PRESS MUST OBEY GERMAN DICTATION

The Hague, Oct. 18, via London, 5 p.m.—The Socialist newspaper Vorwaerts, of Berlin, was published again today, after being suppressed for ten days. In a notice to its readers, signed by the directorate of the Social-Democratic party, it states that the Vorwaerts was suppressed by the order of the military commander of Brandenburg on account of an article dealing with the activities of opponents of Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg. When revocation of the order was asked, the newspaper says, the military commander ordered certain changes in the staff of the editorial department so that necessary guarantee might be had that in future the paper would adhere strictly to the assurances given to the authorities shortly after the outbreak of the war.

## NEW STEAM AUTO POSSESSES REMARKABLE FEATURES

As a result of prolonged experiments a Detroit inventor has developed a steam-power automobile which seems to obviate most of the objections usually presented by vehicles of its type. In a general way it embodies many of the best features of both gas and steam cars. By turning a switch and opening the throttle, the car is started almost instantly. There are no gears, levers, or clutch to operate, while unlimited flexibility is afforded.
