GERMANS PLAN MAINE BASE?

Washington Hears That Submarines Will
Utilize Island Off Coast

The New York Times prints the fol-
lowing Washington dispatch:
Information has reached Washington
that there is a strong probability of the
German admiralty launching a subma-
rine campaign from a secret base on this
side of the Atlantic in an effort to halt
the procession of munition-laden ships
from the United States to British and
French ports. It is known that Grand
Admiral von Tirpitz contemplates a
more vigorous campaign against freight
ships conveying ammunition and war
supplies from this country to the Allies
and it is believed in some quarters that
the attack on the Leyland steamer Ar-
menian may mark a new German subma-
rine campaign against the big fleet
of British and French steamers which
will be carrying munitions in vast quan-
tities to the Allies after July 1.

The information that has now reached
Washington, and which came to the cor-
respondent of the New York Times
from a very reliable source, indicates
the probability of the German undersea
raiders attempting to establish a secret
base on one of the islands off the New
England coast at a point from which
German submarines might make sallies
to attack munition freighters going from
New York and Boston to England and
France.

The establishment of such a base on
the American coast would constitute a
flagrant violation of neutrality, but the
correspondent's informant insisted that
the report had come in so definite a
fashion that it could not be ignored. It
is known that the possibility of such an
action by Germany has been brought to
the attention of officials, who are giving
the matter very serious consideration.

It is by no means an impossibility for
the latest models of German submarines
to cross the Atlantic. It is now known
that the largest and newest of them have
a cruising radius of not less than 5,000
miles.

Once a German submarine base has
been secretly established, it would be a
comparatively easy matter to provide
cleaner routes to that coast and, that
the electric routes to that coast, and that
this fact could be fully appreciated only
by studying a globe and drawing great
circle sailing routes from New York and
Boston to England and the Channel.
