OVER THE WIRES

A reduced scale of wages for labor was approved by the General Contractors' Association at a meeting in Montreal yesterday.

Martin Dickie, manager of the Truro branch of the Royal Bank of Canada, yesterday completed fifty years of service with that institution. He is being warmly congratulated.

Ralph D. Beardsley, son of J. D. Beardsley of Chipman, was injured in a flying accident at Panama. Owing to engine trouble, the machine crashed. Mr. Beardsley received a cut under his arm and a companion had both legs broken. As the result of a trailer railway in Toronto jumping the tracks yesterday and being side-swiped by a street car going in the opposite direction, John Evans, Jr., was fatally injured, and eighteen persons received more or less severe injuries.

The large railroads in New England have announced reductions in wages, effective April 1. The first reduction will apply to unskilled labor only. Conference with employees have been called by the Boston and Albany Railroad, the New York, New Haven and Hartford, and the Boston and Maine Railroad. The request into the death of Captain George Perry, which was to have been postponed until Tuesday, will be resumed this evening. Mansfield Ross and Miss Eleanor Perry have been exonerated, according to officials, as they have shown they were not near the scene of the tragedy at the time.

Lady Rhonda, one of the British women leaders, is employing ex-service officers to carry out housing experiments on her estate in Wales. The housing situation in England is acute.

IN THE POLICE COURT.

In the police court, yesterday afternoon, L. Cowan was charged with cruelty to a horse. A representative of the C. P. C. told of finding the horse in bad condition, and a report of Dr. Donovan showed that the horse was unfit for work. The defendant said he had bought the horse at an auction and thought he was buying one of the city horses, which he knew were sound. The case was postponed to call the auctioneer, J. King Kelley, K. C., represented the S. P. C. and J. A. Barry the accused.

Ernest Dixon, charged with theft on goods from the C.N.R. was before the police court yesterday afternoon and said he rented the room in question to himself and wife, and sub-let to the two girls mentioned in the case. He said the blankets did not belong to the

C. N. R., although two or three years ago the railway did use ones similar. The magistrate said he could not detain the girls in the case much longer, but the case was postponed until Tuesday. D. King Haden represented the C. N. R., and J. A. Barry the defence.

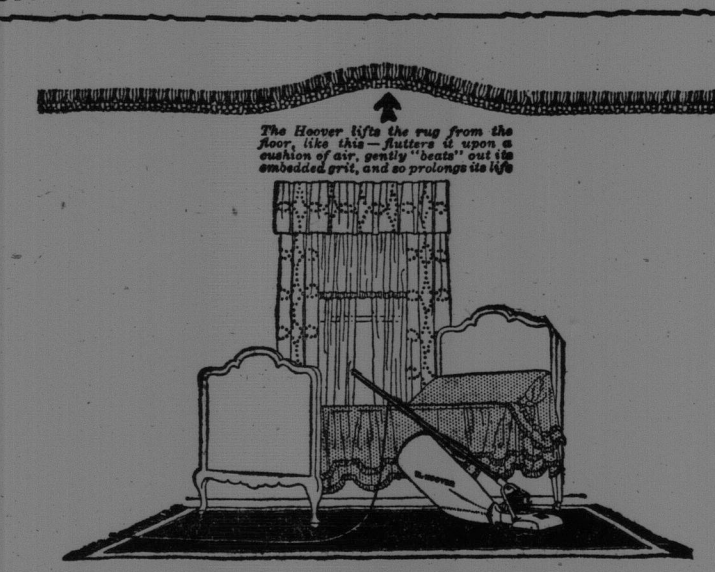
"That will day," said her mistress rigidly.

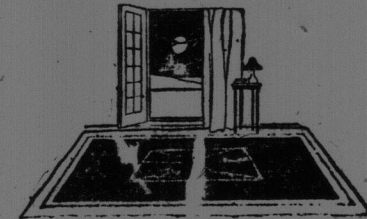
