# FEAR SHIP FROM HERE WILL BE

Lying crippled on the rocks of the Nova Scotia coast, the steamer City of Colombo, which left this port yesterday morning for New York and Philadelphia no route to India, will, in the opinion of men who returned today from the scene of the disaster, be a total loss. At present she is lying side-on to the shore about two miles from the village of Centreville and about sixteen miles west of Digby Gut in very shallow water. Numbers one, two and three holds are filled with water, and her bottom is so badly stove in that pieces of the cargo are dropping out through the large cents. Apparently he rengine-room is still intact, as she had steam up this mornings. It was sald that she was about forty feet from the shore.

The tug Murray Stewart left here at seven o'clock to go to her assistance and left at 6.15, as there was nothing that could be done to help. At the time the Murray Stewart left, the tug Gopher was still standing by, but expected to leave soon, as she could be of no assistance. The dominion government steamer Aberdeen left the scene of the wreckshortly before daylight this morning with about half the crew, which she landed here.
