gested that the numbering of ballots was inadvisable as it might often provide a means for identification of the ballot. The solicitor-general said that the numbered ballot was necessary because if a fraudulent voter used another man's name in voting the bona fide voter had to be sworn and the identity of his vote established for use in case of a recount. Hon, Mackenzie King objected to a sub-section which provided for the appointment by returning officers during polling day of posses of three or more constables each to be used wherever their services might be required. There was always the danger that these squads of police would be used for terrorizing of electors and there was a danger of corruption and of patronage in the appointment of these police. He moved to strike out that section of the clause, and the solicitor-general was agreeable to that being done.

Discussion of clause 65 was centered around a section which provides that "no spirituous or ferinented liquors (whether or not intoxicating) shall be sold or given at any hotel, tavern, shop or other place within the limits of any polling day."

Mr. Morphy objected. It was so drastic, he said, that a man could not accept from his own wife a small portion of stimulant which might prevent him from going into a collapse after a strenuous election day, between five o'clock and twelve at night. He thought it unwise to make the law too drastic. The public was becoming restive of drastic measures.
