

The title part was enacted with pleasing success by Miss Olga DeBaugh, who won her way to the hearts of the audience by her mastery of the role, her singing and dancing and her attractive appearance. AGED ITALIAN PLAYS RARE OLD VIOLIN AT NICKEL

The Ricci Trio Make Splendid Impression at Keith's Popular Picture House

A violinist of the old school, Signor Ricci, of Bologna, Italy, delighted daughter, Sue Ray, pleased greatly in soprano solos, and Master Ricci, a lad of twelve, played prettily on a violin and did some nice little comedy bits. On the whole it was a pretty musical act, quite different from the usual run of such performances, most of which have a lot of flash and smash to them. This was a quiet, refined exposition of the violinist's art and vocal music. Among the numbers heard were "La Palomag," Caprice, the ballad "Mine," a medley of popular airs and the central song from "The Pink Lady."

The picture feature was A Convict's Destiny, being the more or less sad tale of the wrongly accused man who had to wait half his lifetime to have his wrongs righted. Pathe's American company put on this photo play. The Essanay Co. had a fine domestic comedy entitled Anonymous Love—a postal romance farce. Miss Gertrude Townsend sang a sweet number, Sympathy, and was repeatedly encored.


Just One Application and the Hairs are Gone

(Toilet Talks).

The discomforting hairy growths on lip or check vanish following the application of a paste made by mixing enough powdered delatone and water to cover the objectionable hairs. The paste is rubbed off after 2 or 8 minutes and with it comes every trace of hair. The skin should then be washed to remove the remaining delatone and it will be firm and free from spot or blemish. No pain attends this method and rarely is more than one application necessary.

Rubbing pyroxin on eyebrows makes them come in thick and glossy, and short eyelashes will grow long and curly if a little pyroxin be applied at lashroots with thumb and forefinger. Be careful and don't get any pyroxin where no hair is wanted.
