






year and not less than one month, or to both fine and imprisonment. For-feiture of the value of such goods is also provided for. IMPRISONMENT.

IMPRISONMENT. A penalty where the goods smug-gled into Canada are of the value of \$200 or over is also provided. The bill sets out that the penalty, in this in-stance, shall be seven years' imprison-ment, and not less than one year; for a first offence, and to imprisonment for 10 years, and not less than three years, for a second and each subsequent of-fence.
