

MADRID, June 11.—The recent union of the royal houses of Spain and England with the present intimate relations between the governments of the two countries, renders it practically certain that Spain at the coming Hague conference, will follow closely in the wake of England. Indeed it is not impossible that she may advance tentatively propositions which England may not care for the moment to openly espouse. The appointment of Senor Villa Urrutia, the Spanish ambassador to London, and an enthusiastic Anglophite, as chief plenipotentiary is considered conclusive on this point.
