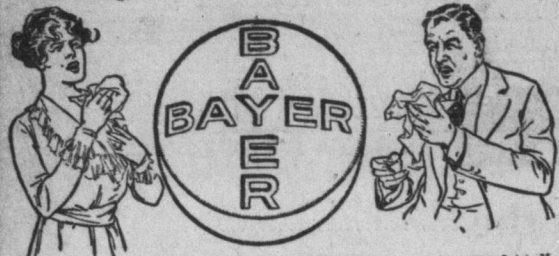

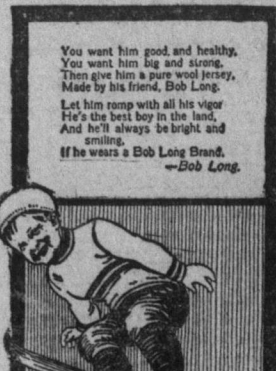
Councillor Struck to attend to the repair of the road east of Town Hall. Andrew Lindner complained re ditch on west side of side line 15.
