The National American Woman Suffrage Association has invited the women voters of the United States to join forces with the association at its convention in St. Louis this month as a most fitting memorial to the half century of suffrage campaign which it has conducted. Except for the women of Wyoming—the State which, as a territory, was franchised its women, and refused to come into the Union without them—every voting woman in the United States has won her suffrage under the banner of the National Association.

New Jersey's first woman marine is Private Anna May English, of Paterson, who is engaged in clerical work in the United States Marine Corps recruiting station in Newark.

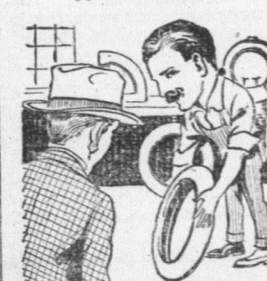
