Bay near this point; it contains 3 stores, pop. 1220.

Cape Porcupine, a station on Cape Breton R., pop. 10.

Cape Sable Island (sub. elec. dis.), a post settlement in Shelburne Co., 5 miles from Barrington, the S. W. extremity of Nova Scotia; lat. 43 deg. 26 N., lon. 65 deg. 38 W. It has a lighthouse with a powerful revolving light, 53 feet above the level of the sea; pop. 2000.

Cape St. George, on the N. E. coast of Nova Scotia. There is a lighthouse on the north side of the Cape with a revolving light three hundred and fifty feet above the level of the sea.

Cape St. Lawrence, the northern extremity of Cape Breton, extending into the Gulf of St. Lawrence; lat. 47 deg. 5 N., lon. 60 deg. 35 W.

Cape St. Mary, a small village in Digby Co., 20 miles from Yarmouth, fare 75 cts., pop. 90.

Cape St. Mary, on the S. W. coast. It has a lighthouse exhibiting a revolving red and white light one hundred and three feet above the level of the sea.

Cape Sambro, on the S. E. coast; lat. 44 deg. 30 N., lon. 63 deg. W. 32 W. It has a lighthouse.

Cape Split, a headland of Nova Scotia extending into the Bay of Fundy; lat. 45 deg. 22 N., lon. 64 deg. 15 W.

Cariboo (sub. elec. dis.), a post settlement in Pictou Co., 4 miles from Pictou, pop. 1340.

Cariboo Cove, a post village in Richmond Co., 7 miles from Port Hawkesbury, fare 25 cts.; It contains 2 stores, pop. 385.

Cariboo Gold Mines, a post office in Halifax Co., pop. 15.

Cariboo Island, off the N. E. coast of Nova Scotia, near the entrance to Pictou Harbor, 5 miles from Pictou; lat. 45 deg., 44 N.; lon. 62 deg. 46 W.

Cariboo Marsh, a post office in Cape Breton County, pop. 20.

Cariboo West, a post settlement in Pictou Co., 5 miles from Pictou, it contains 1 store, 1 saw mill, pop. 30.

Cariboo River, a post settlement in Pictou Co., 6 miles from Pictou, fare 25 cts., pop. 110.
