

cedence from Her Majesty as an ex-Councillor, N. B. Created C.B. (civil) by Her Majesty, 1867, and K.C.M.G. 24 May, 1879. Sworn of the Privy Council and apptd. Minister of Customs for the Dominion, 1 July, 1867. Was Acting Minister of Public Works from Nov. 1868 to April 1869. Was Minister of Finance from 1873 until apptd. Lieut.-Gov. of N.B., a position he held until 11 July, 1878. Re-apptd. Minister of Finance, Oct. 1878, and continued as such until he was re-apptd. Lieut.-Gov. of N.B. 31 Oct., 1885. Sat in Leg. Assem. for City of St. John, N.B., from June 1850 until Nov. 1851, when he resigned; from June 1854 to June 1856, when defeated on the Prohibitory Liquor Law question, and the Govt. resigned; from June 1857 to March 1865, when defeated on the Union policy of his Govt., and again from 1866 until the Union, when he resigned to accept a seat in the Commons and represent N.B. in the Dominion Cabinet. Sat in the Commons from the Union until apptd. Lieut.-Gov. of N.B., 1873, and again from g.e. 1878 until re-apptd. Lieut.-Gov. The Prohibitory Liquor Law of N. B. was the work of Mr. Tilley as a private mem.; amongst other measures of importance introduced and carried by the Govt. of which he was a mem., may be mentioned the following;—Vote by ballot and extension of the franchise; an Act authorizing the construction of the European and North American Railway as a Govt. work; an Act authorizing the construction of the Intercolonial Railway, N.B., agreeing to pay three-and-a-half-twelfths of the cost; an Act granting facility for the construction of certain Railways, under which 230 miles have since been built in N.B. On the formation of Sir John A. Macdonald's Administration in 1878, the re-adjustment and re-organization of the Customs Tariff in accordance with the policy of that Govt., which had for its object the protecting and fostering of Canadian industry.—*Fredericton; St. John, N.B.*
