

An Act to incorporate the Village of Ayr, in the County of Waterloo.

WHEREAS the Inhabitants of the Village of Ayr, in the County of Waterloo, have by their Petition represented, that from the rapid increase of the population of the said Village it has become necessary to confer upon it corporate powers, and have prayed that it may be incorporated accordingly, and it is desirable to grant the prayer of the said Petition: Therefore Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows:

Preamble.

I. From and after the passing of this Act, the Inhabitants of the said Village of Ayr shall be a body corporate apart from the Township of North Dumfries in which the said Village is situate; and as such shall have perpetual succession and a Common Seal, with such powers and privileges as are now or shall hereafter be conferred on Incorporated Villages in Upper Canada, and the powers of such Corporation shall be exercised by, through and in the name of the Municipality of the Village of Ayr.

Ayr incorporated as a Village.

II. The said Village shall comprise and consist of the tract of land comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say: Commencing at the centre of the Seventh Concession of the said Township of North Dumfries on the limit between lots thirty-two and thirty-three; thence in a westerly course along the centre of said concession to the Road allowance between Lots 36 and 37; thence in a northerly course along said Road allowance to a point in a line with the southerly boundary of a portion of land now occupied by George Allchin, Esquire, on Lot thirty-seven in said concession; thence in a westerly course along said boundary to Smith's Creek; thence up said creek to the present travelled road, given in lieu of part of the said Road allowance; thence in a northerly direction along said travelled Road to the easterly line of said Road allowance; thence in a northerly course along said Road allowance to another portion of travelled road given in lieu of the said Road allowance; thence continuing a northerly course along said travelled Road to where it again intersects said original Road allowance between Lots 36 and 37; thence continuing in a northerly course along said Road allowance to the centre of the eighth Concession; thence in an easterly course along the centre of the Concession to the north-east angle of a portion of land occupied by George Colcleugh, Esquire, and known as the Distillery Lot; thence in a southerly course along the easterly side of said Distillery Lot, and along the limit between Lots 32 and 33 across the south half of the eighth and the north half of the seventh Concessions to the place of beginning.

Boundaries of the Village.

III. Immediately after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for the Governor of this Province to appoint a Returning Officer for the said Village of Waterloo, which Returning Officer shall appoint the time and

Governor to appoint a Returning Officer.
