An Important Notice to Students

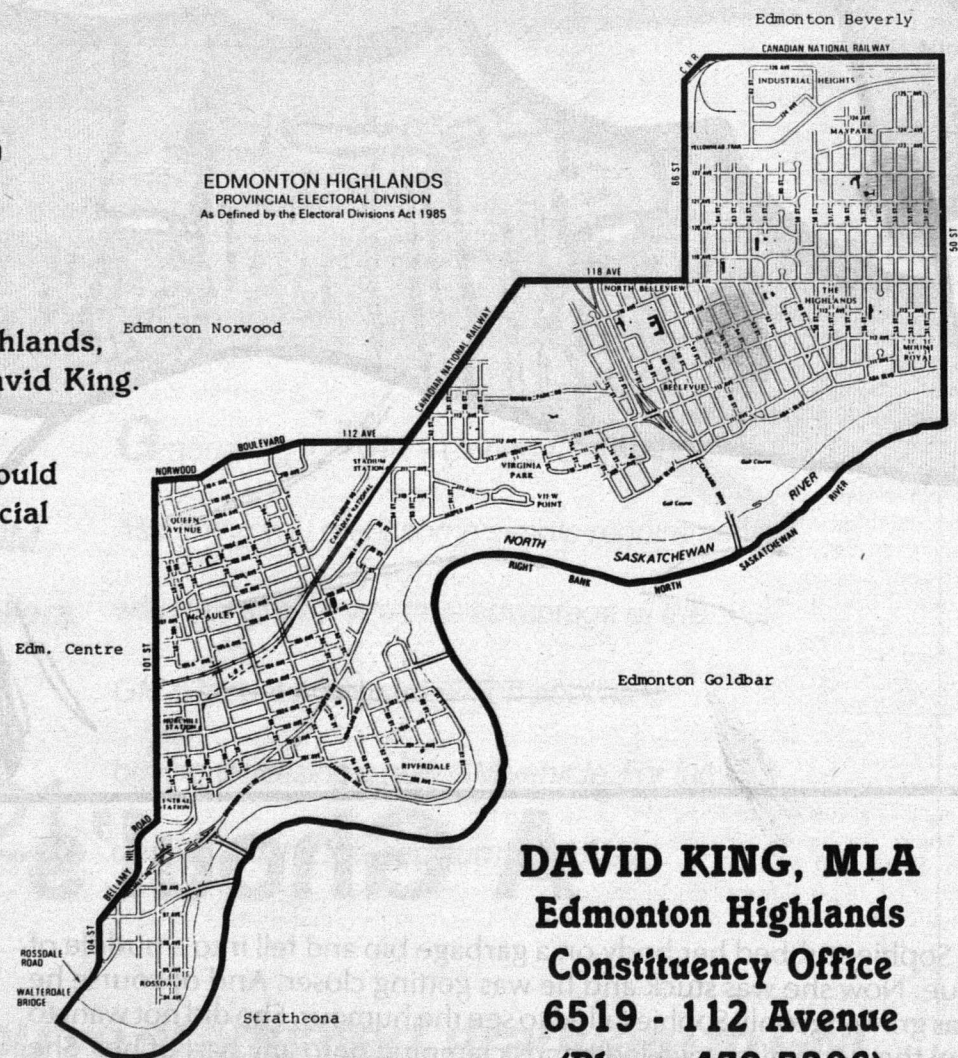
If you can find your home on this map...
