
EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD

Two Dr. Allan P. Stuart Memorial Awards are presented at Encaenia in May of each year to recognize excellence in teaching.

Nominations are invited now for these awards for teachers of first term courses only. In the second term, there will be a call for nominations of teachers of second term and year courses. All nominations will be considered together in the spring by the Senate Quality of Teaching Committee.

Nominations may be made by students or by faculty members, and must bear the name and addresses of at least two nominators. They must include some supporting statement, and should be based on the following criteria: comprehensive knowledge of the subject, preparation for class, enthusiasm for subject and ability to arouse interest; encouraging student participation; setting high standards and motivating students to attain them; communicating effectively at appropriate levels; evaluating students on their understanding of the subject rather than on ability to memorize; and being accessible to students outside of class.
