

the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs from granting Mining Licenses or taking Mining Locations within the said Reservations to prevent the granters or purchasers of such locations from working Mines and Manufacturing or exporting the Minerals found therein. And that the Indians shall continue to reside upon and Cultivate the said Reservation or any part of it and retain all the rights and privileges which they have hitherto enjoyed in relation thereto (excepting only the right of cutting or disposing of pine timber) without hindrance or molestation on the part of the said party of the second part.

11th That time shall be of the essence of this Agreement, and that if default be made by the party of the second part in the payment of any of the monies as above mentioned when due or in the performance of any of the Covenants of the Agreement to be performed by him then the Covenant of the Agreement to be performed by the parties of the first part shall be utterly void and of none effect and they may at their pleasure sell or otherwise dispose of the pine timber on the said Reservation to any other person or persons anything in this Agreement to the contrary notwithstanding.
