ESSEX NORTH August 13th, 1912

Organizer W.H.Adams reports as follows " I conferred with President Montreuil At Walke rville. Secretary Davis at Windsor, Dr. P. A. Dewar Late Dominion candidate, S. Ducharme late Provincial candidate, W.C. Kennedy and A.F. Healey, both of Windsor who were aspirants for the last Dominion nomination. Lists posted are Sandwich Townships, East and West, and West Rochester Township. Belle River Village, and Sandwich Town. Judge McHugh heard the appeals in Belle River to-day. Nine names were added, eight Grits and one Tory, according to Mr. Ducharme who is clerk of other lists posted. I am assured that Sandwich Township East and West Rochester Townships will be well looked after. Also Sandwich Town. I found it very difficult to make much headway in arranging ways and means at first to have balance of lists looked after. You will be aware of the condition of affairs there at the time of the last North Essex Dominion convention. Very little change has occurred sunce then in these conditions. Kennedy and Healey both want the next convention and both have a strong following, the former in Windsor and the latter in the Dr. Dewar told me he would not accept another Country. nominiation, unless it came in about three or four years time. Last campaign made big inroads in his practice which he is now endeavouring to retrieve. From carefuly inquiry and observation my candidepinion is that an English speaking Catholic would win North Essex and W.C.Kennedy looks like a winner to me. He is successful business man and wealthy and will spend his money if nominated. He is a fair speaker and a winning personality, and is brim full of the right ideas of organization. A French candidate is out of the question owing to time honoured custom of selecting an English speaking man for the Dominion and a French speaking man for the Provincial. Kennedy besides is known as a fairminded man free from bigotry. His wife is a Protestant and he stood aside for a Protestant last convention which act is fully known and appreciated by the Protestant Grits . In an effort to help things along incidentally, but principally to arrange for ways and means to revise the lists properly, I have succeeded in having all the interested parties meet together next Tuesday
