- More Indians on correctional service and probation services ---- 70

- Establish extensive anti-poverty programs ---- 310, 394
- Adequate supplemental welfare payments ---- 310, 394

- More residences in N W T and Yukon for training of native girls ---- 160

- Preference in job recruitment should be given to local persons ---- 310
