With respect to your complaints to the Depart ment, made through Mr. Jooke, against your husband for immorality and failure to support you, and your request that in consequence of those a division of your husband'. property be made between your husband and yourself, I beg to say that while the Department regrets the circumstances which you relate, it does not appear that the Department can do much to improve matters, even if the charges you make were proven. The Department cannot improve the relations between your husband and yourself, neither has i power to make a division of the property between you. Th would have to be a matter of agreement between yourselv.

I am enclosing a copy of a letter that is by sent to your husband asking him to authorize the Depart to pay you a portion of his monthly salary. If he declin āc āc this it appears that the only thing left for you do is to take proceedings against him for non-support u the provisions of the Criminal Code.
