Sir,-

Your letter of the 21st ultimo addressed to Mr. C.H. Gibbons, Secretary of the Royal Commission, has been forwarded here with the explanation that the Royal Commission has no authority to provide lands for Agent's Offices or residency purposes.

Enclosed herewith is a blue print plan of the Klick-umcheen Indian Reserve. Please note at the southerly end of the reserve that an addition was made by Order-in-Council of the 19th May 1903, which included lots 5, 6 and 7 in the easterly half of block 20 in the town of Lytton. You evidently were not aware that this land was included in the Indian Reserve, as your sketch shows that these are three of the lots that you recommend should be obtained. Application will be made for the remaining lot No. 4 in the westerly half of the said block 20, noted in your sketch. Please inform me as soon as possible whether the said lot 4 will be required for Agency purposes or in the interest of the Indian who has a house on it, and consequently as an addition to the Indian Reserve.
