- Did William ever take wood off 98?
- A. No. He was not able to, he was always sick.
- Q. Did he ever take wood off 150?
- A. He was not able to.
- Q. Between being in the Hudson's Bay service and being ill he was not able to take any wood from anywhere? A. No. sir.
- Q. How long before his death did William buy Lot 150 from Bear?
- A. I couldn't say, it was a number of years.
- Q. What would be a number of years?
- A. Six or seven or something like that.
- Q. You think as long as that before his death? A. Yes.
- Q. How long before William's death did he buy Lot 96?
- A. It would only be about three years.
- Q. Did he buy 150 at the same time that he bought 96?
- A. Yes Sir.
- Q. How do you know that he bought these two lots from Bear?
- A. He told me.
- Q. Who told you?
- A. William
- Q. Did William tell you that before he went into the Hudson's Bay service or after?
- A. I couldn't say.
- Q. You couldn't say.
- A. INBRESERVENERE NO.
- Q. How long before his death did he tell you he had bought them?
- A. I couldn't say.
- Q. The only reason you know that he bought from Bear is that he told you, is it?
- A. Yes.
