

5th Witness - Dingnis Van Renen, Brandenburgeweg 45, de Bilt having been duly sworn states;

I am a burier. In June of 1945 the policeman Dyk and Zuster came to me and brought a body. They brought it with a truck with two Canadian soldiers. I did not know who the body was. When we undressed the body we found some papers with his name and address. We put the body in the morgue. Two days later the body was taken away by an undertaker.

6th Exam - This happened at 0200 hrs on 6th June 45. I did not have a Canadian officer come to see the body. I did not recognise any officer. I told the undertaker that the body was taken away by the ^{4th} car belonging to Stock, Utrecht and brought to de Bilt. I do not know where it was brought. I thought home but I am not sure. I was not continually with the body for the two days. It was the 6th of June.

Re Exam - It was brought in at 0200 hrs on 6th June. I don't remember the day of the week.

R.P. 83(b) complied with.

6th Witness - Hend Van Doorn, 95 Minuststraat, de Bilt, having been duly sworn states;

I am an undertaker in de Bilt, Billthoven and neighbourhood. I was either called by telephone or someone came to me on 7th June. I went to the family of Kops in Muntersloot and accepted the order for burial. We placed the body in the coffin the following Saturday morning. The body was that of Kops. It was a big heavy body.
