men in responsible positions—had had a restoration of polygamy suggested to them. It was done cautiously, but—

"Brother R- said that God is the same yesterday, to-day, and forever. He said that the principles of God's truth are changeless and eternal too- that the principle of celestial or plural marriage was as true to-day as ever it had been. And he was followed by Brother S-, who declared that the Lord would restore polygamy and open up a way for His people to practise it—and there would then be an opportunity for the young men assembled, and others, to live that part of their religion-and while it wouldn't be compulsory, any one rejecting it would stand responsible at the judgmentseat for failing in his duty.
