It contains a Baptist church and a public school, and ships grain and fruit. Population, 200. Mail daily. L B Tanner, postmaster.

BURTON. A small place in Manvers township, Durham County, 30 miles north-west of Cobourg, the county seat, and 8 north-west of Pontypool, on the O & Q sec O div C P Ry, its nearest railroad point. Nearest bank at Millbrook. Grain is shipped. Stages daily to Bethany and Pontypool. Population, 25. Mail daily. James McGill, postmaster.

BURY'S GREEN. A village in Somerville township, Victoria County, 23 miles north of Lindsay, the county seat, and nearest banking point, and 2½ west of Fell's on the W and H line M div G T Ry, its nearest railway point. Settled in 1858. It contains Episcopal and Presbyterian

churches, and common schools, and ships grain, cordwood and ties. Population, 75. Mail daily. John Fell, postmaster.

It contains a Methodist church and a public school, and ships grain and produce. Stages daily to Seaforth and Wrcxeter. Population, 20. Mail daily. James Newcombe, postmaster.

BUSH GLEN. A post office in Osnabrock township, Stormont County, 24 miles west of Cornwall, the county seat, and 9 from Aultsville, on the G T Ry, its nearest railway point. Nearest bank at Morrisburgh. Settled in 1843. It has Methodist and Presbyterian churches, and common school, and ships grain and produce. Population, 50. Mail daily. Gordon Bush, postmaster.

BUTLER. A station on the C P Ry, 160 miles north-west of Port Arthur. Not a post office. Express, Dominion.

BUTTONVILLE. A village on Rouge river (which supplies power) in Markham township, York County, 18 miles north-east of Toronto, the county seat, 5 from Markham, the nearest bank, and 3 west of Unionville, on the Midland div G T Ry, its nearest shipping point. Stages daily to Unionville and Markham. Settled in 1820. It contains Methodist, Lutheran and Presbyterian churches, and a public school, and ships produce. Population, 150. Mail daily. Thomas Thomson, postmaster.
