VANCOUVER, B. C.—Building on Hastings street for the Bank of Nova Scotia; Dalton & Eveleigh, architects; T. Horrobin, contractor.

OTTAWA, ONT.—Contract for sub-structures for two new bridges over the Lachine canal at Cote St. Paul has been awarded to Coulson, Quinlan & Robertson.

CALGARY, N. W. T. — Boyd & Sutor have been awarded the contract for erection of grand stand, cattle stables and main pavilion on the exhibition grounds; price, \$12,218.

ST. CATHARINES, ONT. — For construction of a sewer on Ontario street tenders were received as follows: J. McKnight, Toronto, \$1,503; Newman Bros., city, \$1,334; City Engineer, \$1,226.55.

WALKERVILLE, ONT. — Three Kelsey warm air generators are to be in-

at the bottom with a general depth of about 6 feet. About 40,000 acres of land will be irrigated.

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
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
