CAP. XII.

An Ordinance to make provision for defraying the Civil Expenditure of the Provincial Government from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, to the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight.

Preamble.

THEREAS it is expedient to make provision towards defraying the expenses of Her Majesty's Civil Government of this Province, and of the Admi. nistration of Justice therein, from the first day of April, which was in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, to the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight :- Be it therefore Ordained and Enacted by the Administrator of the Government of this Province, authorized to execute the Commission of the Governor thereof, by and with the advice and consent of the Special Council for the affairs of the said Province, constituted and assembled, by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to " make temporary provision for the Government of Lower Canada;"—and it is hereby Ordained and Enacted by the authority of the same, that from and out of the unapsterling, to be propriated moneys which now are, or shall hereafter come into the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, for the time being, there shall be paid and applied towards defraying the expenses of the Administration of Justice and the support of the Civil Government of this Province, incurred from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, to the tenth day of April, one thouof Justice and sand eight hundred and thirty-eight, both days inclusive, such sum or sums as, support of Ci- together with the sums which may be in the Receiver General's hands at the time of the passing of this Act, at the disposal of the Crown, applicable to such purposes, April 1837, to shall amount to a sum not exceeding forty-seven thousand, three hundred and fortyfour pounds, fourteen shillings and seven pence, sterling.

A sum not exceeding £47,-344 14s. 7d., paid out of unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, for adment, from 1st 10th April, 1838.

To be accounted for.

II. And be it further Ordained and Enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the moneys appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, her heirs and successors shall direct.
