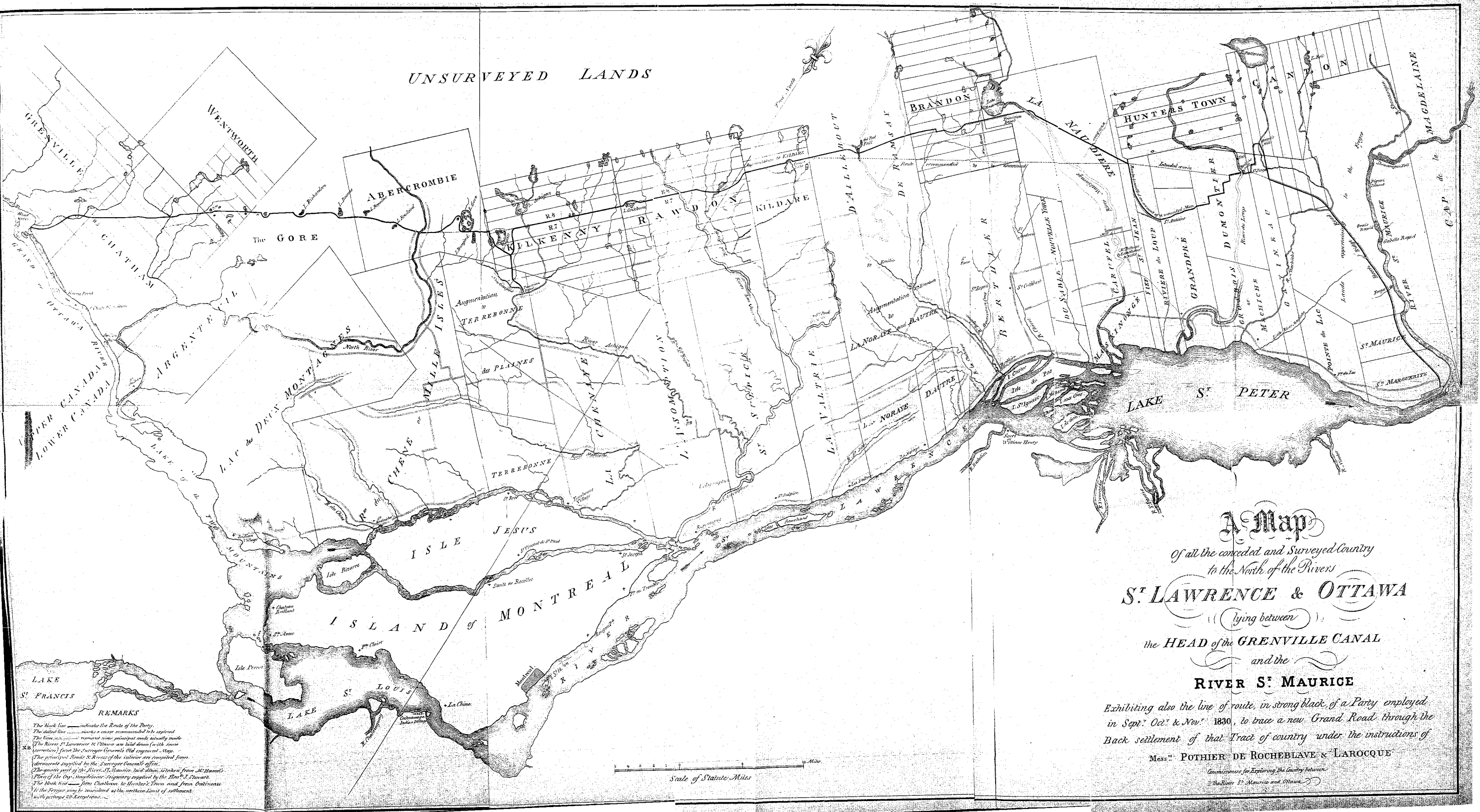




UNSURVEYED LANDS

REMARKS
The thick line indicates the Route of the Party.
The dotted line marks a route recommended to be explored.
The line with crosses represents some principal roads actually made.
The Rivers S^t Lawrence & Ottawa are laid down with some
variations from the Surveyor General's old engraved Map.
The principal Roads & Rivers of the interior are compiled from
documents supplied to the Surveyor General's office.
The greater part of the River S^t Maurice laid down is taken from McDaniel's
Plan of the Cay. Authenticity of the River S^t Lawrence supplied by the Hon^{ble} J. Stewart.
The thick line from Chatham to Hunter's Town and from Chatham
to the River may be considered as the northern limit of settlement
with perhaps 20 exceptions.
