were sold yesterday for 10 tec per lb. The facts are incontrovertible, and need no comment. Prastically all lines of cattle
were off more or less, but the drop was more marked in the light and heavy butcher class. One good load of 23 butcher
averaging 950 lbs., sold early in the forenoon at 811.90 , and there were scales of other lots at around that figure. As indicating how slow the trade wa the market, only 800 had gone over the
scales at $120^{\circ}$ clock, Later they moved out faster, but the trade was very slow
thruout. For the very heavy cattle there was no sale, and at three o'clock not an
offer had been received for some lots. The total receipts were 159 cars, com-
prising 2390 cattle, 146 calves, 1447 hogs and 71 sheep.
