

LIVE STOCK MARKETS TORONTO.

Trading on the Union Stock Yards yes-terday was characterized, especially for some lines of cattle, by another sharp decline in prices similar to that of a fortnight ago, and variously placed from 25c to 50c per cwt. In some individual cass the drop in the price was said to be even more marked, but these were the exception. There was a heavy run of eattle, 2,900 head in all, a big proportion of them good stuff, and with the packing houses showing a disposition to hold off or it for the commission house and dro

The fact of the matter is, and it is wel known, that the cattle for the most part were bought too high in the country and the logical sequence is that some body is losing money. Individual case were cited where the drover had paid 12c per lb. in the country for 18 butcher cattle averaging around 1100 lbs., and ship ped them into the market, where they were sold yesterday for 103c per lb. The facts are incontrovertible, and need no comment. Practically all lines of cattle were off more or less, but the drop was more marked in the light and heavy butther class. One good load of 23 butcher averaging 950 lbs., sold early in the foreoon at \$11.90, and there were scales of ther lots at around that figure.

As indicating how slow the trade was was stated that, out of 2900 cattle or the market, only 800 had gone over the scales at 12 o'clock, Later they moved out faster, but the trade was very slow bruout. For the very heavy cattle there was no sale, and at three o'clock not an offer had been received for some lots. The total receipts were 159 cars, comprising 2890 cattle, 146 calves, 1447 hogs ind 71 sheep.

Milkers and springers were in fairly good demand at practically unchanged

Sheep and lambs-Choice light sheep sold at from 81c to 91c; heavy, fat sheep and bucks at from 7½c to 8½c, and choice vearlings at from 11½c to 13e while spring lambs are quoted from 15c to 18c per lb. Practically all sheep now com ing on the market are clipped. The trade in heavy, fat sheep is very dull, and becoming increasingly.
